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## Must Do's for NEW ARL TEACHERS

Once CCSD ARL candidates get hired as teachers, they will need to fulfill additional in-service (post-hire) requirements in order to maintain their ARL conditional teaching licenses.

Ongoing CCSD Professional Development (PD) and School-Site Mentoring

Support during the first year of teaching is crucial for success. See below for some of the ways our new ARL teachers are supported during their first contracted year of hire.



New ARL teachers will need to complete additional CCSD professional development (PD) hours. This mandatory assigned PD will be distributed by email once a candidate is hired.



Principals assign each ARL new teacher a mentor once he or she begins teaching at the school site.

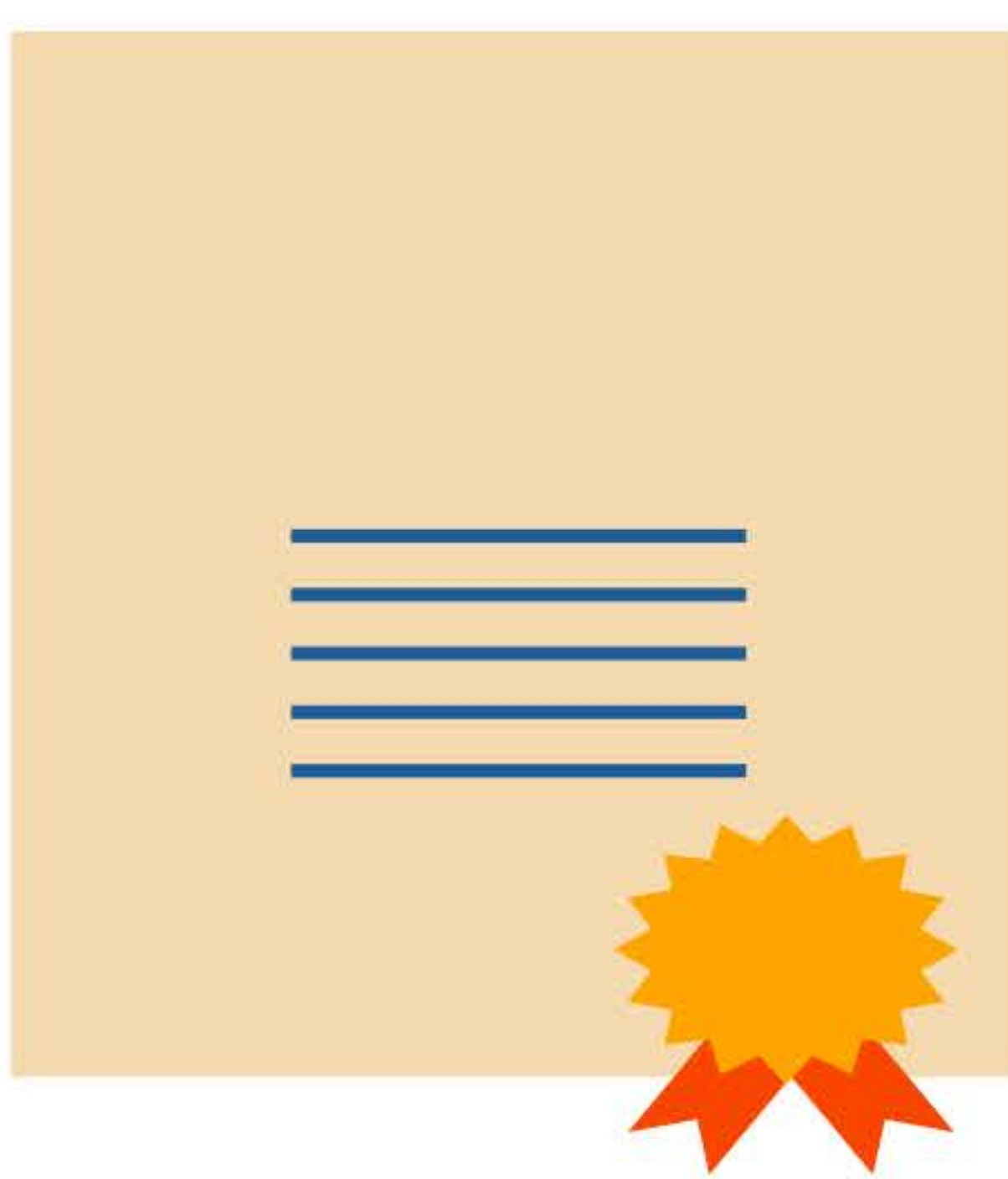
New ARL teachers meet with their mentors weekly for much needed site support and guidance.

Nevada Department of Education (NDE) Coursework Requirements and Provision Removal

ARL new teachers complete the NDE coursework required for each area of licensure at an accredited institute(s) of higher education. There are many local institutes for consideration.

The NDE will issue each ARL conditional license with specific provisions. Teachers must remove these provisions by the date indicated.

ARL teachers will have three (3) years from the date of conditional licensure to complete all coursework and remove all provisions. At that time, ARL teachers can convert their conditional licenses into standard teaching licenses.

Successful Evaluations

Convert to standard licensure.

Teach for three (3) years.

Complete the ARL Program.

ARL teachers must teach in their area of licensure in a CCSD public school (no charter schools).

There are over 360 schools in the Clark County School District. Teachers do not have to teach at the same school for the three (3) years.

Successful evaluations are needed for each year of teaching during this time frame.

CCSD ARL teachers may convert their conditional license in as little as two (2) years.
